Did you know?...

- Baby's brain grows over one million neural connections every second
- A baby's brain doubles in size in their first year.
- By their third birthday, 80% of the baby's brain is developed.
- Don't just use English, now's the time to lay down the foundations for additional languages. If you speak another language at home – awesome! Science actually proves that multilingual babies are brainier!

These everyday moments, filled with talk, connection, and fun, are not just interactions – they are brain-building experiences that shape a child's future learning and relationships.
